1 Process for Acquiring LAUSD Data

1. Send an inquiry email to the director of the LAUSD, currently Kathy Hayes at kathy.hayes@lausd.net.
2. The director will then respond with pdf instructions on how to format a research proposal.
3. Once the proposal is complete, the proposal will be reviewed by the Committee for External Research Review (CERR).
4. Once approved, researchers must sign the necessary confidentiality agreement and complete orientation and a required FERPA training class before access to the data may begin.

- To proceed with a Freedom of Information Act Request (FOIA), the researcher must submit a formal request by following the instructions here: <https://www.uscis.gov/records/request-records-through-the-freedom-of-information-act-or-privacy-act>. The researcher must justify their study and request specific data.
- If approved, you will receive the requested restricted-access data on password protected CDs.
